DISSIDENT LATTER DAY SAINT GROUPS

Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Of the groups which broke away from the Mormon Church at the time of Joseph Smith's death only five remain in existence. Of these only the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints is a large religious body. With its headquarters in Independence, Mo., this group had 146,076 members in 1957. It was organized by Mormons who rejected Brigham Young's leadership and many theological innovations, especially relating to polygamy and temple work. It came together in 1852 and has been recognized by the courts as the successor of the church founded by Joseph Smith, winning title to both the Kirtland Temple and the Temple Lot in Independence. Joseph Smith's widow and his immediate family adhered to this group, and his son became its president in 1860. The presidency has continued to be held by his direct descendants. The organization of the Reorganized Church is similar to that of the Utah church. Like the latter, it emphasizes a social ethic and cooperation and at an earlier time operated a large cooperative unit in southern Iowa. Many who did not go West joined this cooperative venture. The belief in contemporary revelation and its role in running church business is much more striking than in the Utah church. Also, like the latter, the Reorganized Church carries on missionary activity.

Church of Christ, Temple Lot.—This group, which lost the lot to the Reorganized Church in a lawsuit in the early 1890's, had only

3,000 members in 1956. It was founded by Granville Hedrick at the time of Joseph Smith's death, and returned to Independence in 1867. It rejects many Mormon beliefs, such as deification of men

after death and polygamy.

The Church of Jesus Christ (Bickertonites).—This group, which had 2,340 members in 1957, descends from those who left the Mormon body with Sidney Rigdon (1793-1876) after the death of Joseph Smith, although it was organized by William Bickerton in 1862. Rigdon was an important leader in early Mormondon and was defeated by Brigham Young for the position of Joseph Smith's successor. This group rejects baptism for the dead, plural marriage, and other Mormon developments. It conducts missionary work among the Indians in the United States and Canada.

Church of Jesus Christ of Latter day Saints (Strangites).- This body had only 200 members in 1957; but a century carlier, James J. Strang (1813-1856), its founder and a colorful contender for Joseph Smith's position, ruled as "king" over some 3,000 followers on Mackinac Island, Mich. Strang claimed that he was Smith's personal choice for the succession. Despite the striking impression he made on Mormons outside of Nauvoo, his claims did not receive serious support. Strang also claimed revelations. In

1856 he was shot to death by two of his fo ers, who were hailed as heroes by antager neighbors on the mainland.
